EVERY MECHANIC SHOULD HAVE


Maybe sometimes you wonder how hard it is to take on some of the car maintenance yourself so that in turn, you keep more cash in your pocket.





Useful for:


- Brake jobs

Useful for:


- Torquing tire lug nuts

5 SCREWDRIVER SET

Useful for:


- · General car repairs

LIQUID PENETRANT


Useful for:

MULTI-METER




Useful for:

- Suspension work






OIL DRIP PAN

TOP 20 TOOLS EVERY MECHANIC SHOULD HAVE






Useful for:

FLOOR JACK




Useful for:


- Keeping the vehicle off the ground while you do your work

Useful for:






· Doing heavy work

- Learning more about the troubleshooting part








Useful for:
